Greenfield-Central Schools High Ability Education Identification Testing Session for New Students May 6th, 2017

Greenfield-Central Schools will offer an opportunity for students, entering grades 1-9, who will be new to Greenfield-Central schools for the 2017-18 school year to be assessed for High Ability programming. High Ability courses provide instruction that is one or more years above grade level and uses more frequent high level thinking strategies.

Greenfield-Central uses data from two different assessments (NWEA for Achievement and CogAT for Aptitude) as qualifying scores for High Ability pathways in English Language Arts, Mathematics and Science.

An assessment session will be held Saturday, May 6th at Greenfield Intermediate School beginning at 8:00 AM. Time needed to complete the session will vary. The deadline to register for this assessment session will be Friday, April 28th.
