In a partnership with Brandywine Creek Farms, Hancock Health is providing low cost, fresh produce @ various locations throughout the county. Starting the week of June 25 and going through mid-October, the produce truck will be available at the locations listed below. Each location is open for 4 hours. Families with financial need may obtain a seasonal voucher at most family doctors' offices in Hancock County. The voucher plus \$1 will purchase a bag of produce. Other families will be able to purchase produce at ½ the current retail value.

2-1-1 is an information and referral line that connects people to vital social services, such as food, clothing, shelter, counseling, etc. When a person calls 2-1-1, specially-trained information and referral personnel assess what services are needed and provide the appropriate resource and related information.

❖ **Central Indiana Council on Aging (CICOA)**

Meal voucher program for adults 60 and older. The adult will receive a re-usable meal card to redeem at participating locations serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner. The vouchers can be obtained for \$3 per meal. No income restrictions apply, but there is an eight-voucher monthly limit.
